



RS Tera Inland Championship Regatta Fleet 13th & 14th July 2019

NOTICE OF RACE

The Organising Authority is Rutland Sailing Club in Conjunction with the RS Tera Class Association
UK

1. RULES

- 1.1 The regatta will be governed by the rules as defined in The Racing Rules of Sailing 2017 – 2020
- 1.2 International RS Tera Class Rules will apply.
- 1.3 Competitors shall sail in accordance with the Royal Yachting Association (RYA) Racing Charter.
- 1.4 Other than the matters included in this notice of race, no racing rule changes will apply. Racing rule changes will appear in full in the sailing instructions.

2. ADVERTISING

Advertising is permitted in accordance with the class rules and WS Regulation 20.

Boats may be required to display advertising chosen and/or supplied by the Organising Authority

The following parts of the hulls and sails must be left clear for the possible display of supplied advertising:

- i) the front 1m of the bow
- ii) the bottom 10% of the mainsail
- iii) the front 50cm of the boom nearest the mast

The final day of racing will be 14th July 2019, no warning signal will be made after 1530 on 14th July 2019.

At the Race Officers Discretion it is likely that all races during a day will be sailed without time to go ashore between races.

5 SAILING INSTRUCTIONS

The Sailing Instructions shall be available on the Official Notice Board and will be posted on the Rutland Sailing Club and/or UK RS Tera Class Association website no later than Friday, June 29th 2019. Paper copies will not be available at registration.

6 RACE AREAS

Racing will be on Rutland Water.



7 THE COURSES

The courses to be used will be presented to competitors at the competitors briefing and included in the Sailing Instructions.

10 SCORING

The Low Point System of Appendix A will apply.

10.1 RACES REQUIRED TO CONSTITUTE A SERIES

1 race shall be completed to constitute a series.

10.2 RACES TO COUNT FOR TOTAL SCORE

The total score for each boat will be the sum of her scores as follows:

- (a) When up to 3 races are completed then all race scores shall count.
- (b) When between 4 and 6 races are completed then all race scores will count except her worst score.
- (c) When 7 or more races are completed then all race scores will count except her worst two scores.

11 SUPPORT BOATS

No support boats other than those officially involved in the organisation of the event will be allowed to launch.

The official event photographer may move between the starting line and course marks in order to photograph the event, this boat will display a distinguishing flag.

12 BOATS AND TRAILER STORAGE

Boats shall be kept in their assigned places in the dinghy park for the duration of the regatta unless instructed otherwise.

13 RADIO COMMUNICATION

Except in an emergency, a boat shall neither make radio transmissions while racing nor receive radio communications not available to all boats. This restriction also applies to mobile telephones.

14 PRIZES

(a) RS Tera Regatta Fleet 1st as a minimum.

15 DISCLAIMER OF LIABILITY

RRS 4 of the Racing Rules of Sailing states: 'The responsibility for a boat's decision to participate in a race or to continue racing is hers alone.'

Sailing is by its nature an unpredictable sport and therefore inherently involves an element of risk. By taking part in the event, each competitor agrees and acknowledges that:

- (a) They are aware of the inherent element of risk involved in the sport and accept responsibility for the exposure of themselves, their crew and their boat to such inherent risk whilst taking part in the event;
- (b) They are responsible for the safety of themselves, their crew, their boat and their property whether afloat or ashore;
- (c) They accept responsibility for any injury, damage or loss to the extent caused by their own actions or omissions;
- (d) Their boat is in good order, equipped to sail in the event and they are fit to participate;
- (e) The provision of a race management team, patrol boats and other officials and volunteers by the event organiser does not relieve them of their own responsibilities;
- (f) The provision of patrol boat cover is limited to such assistance, particularly in extreme weather conditions, as can be practically provided in the circumstances;

- (g) Their boat is adequately insured, with cover of at least £3,000,000 against third party claims;

16 RIGHT & COPYRIGHT

In participating in the RS Tera Inland Championship any competitor automatically grants to the Organising Authority, the National and International Class Associations permission to make, use and show, from time to time, any motion pictures and live, taped or film television and other reproductions of him/her during the period of the event without compensation, in perpetuity.

17 FURTHER INFORMATION

Accommodation: Is available in bunk rooms within the clubhouse. The cost is £16 per night for a bed in a room with a shower or £14 without. Accommodation should be booked direct with the club office on 01780 720292 or sailing@rutlandsc.co.uk .

Restrictions: The following restrictions apply to all visitors to Rutland Sailing Club .

1. All visiting boats must comply with Anglian Waters Check Clean & Dry requirements. Any boat that arrives at our site, may be inspected, and if found to be a concern refused entry. Further details on Check, Clean & Dry can be found at: <http://www.nonnativespecies.org/checkcleandry/>
2. Camping in the grounds is not permitted in our lease with our landlords Anglian Water. This includes camping and overnight sleeping in cars, camper vans and tents. 3. Dogs are not allowed on site, either in cars or on leads.
